Firstly, to my fellow Board members, many of which are also heavily involved in some way or another on the Committees of each of our six clubs – especially recognizing for most they outrank me significantly in experience – your council is most respected and appreciated.

To Anthony McGettigan, the one-man army from Cricket NSW, any task that looks to be losing its needed time and attention, he is quickly picking up without need for praise or acknowledgment; a thank you also must go to his colleagues in Jerim Hayes and Beck Frostick.

CRICKET NSW REPORT

Season 2024-25 commenced on 19th October and culminated with the senior Grand finals on 15th March with a lot has happening during this time, both on and off the field.

The season saw a number of changes, events and other interesting moments which arose;

- A Strategic Partnership arrangement was formalised by the CWW Board with Cricket NSW to operate the overall running of the competition
- For the first time we had two clubs with female Presidents – St Michaels and Wagga City
- The senior representative cricket program was resurrected, with Wagga winning back the O'Farrell Cup from Hay, and will defend it this season commencing with the Cup Centenary match in late November.
- St Michaels won both the 1st grade and inaugural 2nd grade T20 competitions – this was the club's first silverware in either of those grades for a number of years
- Wagga City played in their fifth consecutive 1st grade T20 final, and have now played in all 7 T20 finals conducted in 1st grade
- Wagga City club was also crowned both senior and junior club champions
- Across all grades there were almost 300 matches, over 81400 runs scored and over 4200 wickets taken
- 10 centuries were scored in 1st grade, and 26 across the senior grades compared with 5 and 17 in 23/24
- Interestingly, not one of the 7 teams who were minor premiers in senior or junior grades took out their respective premierships!

Whilst this role is charged with the overall running of the CWW junior and senior competitions, without the support of all parties this doesn't happen and everyone's efforts have to be acknowledged.

To everyone involved in Cricket Wagga - the club volunteers (who do a mountain of work), the players, coaches and the Board - I extend my personal "thank you".

My thanks and appreciation extend further to the other participants in our game who are not always forefront of our minds but also do an important job each weekend to get the games up and running – the curators and groundsmen, the umpires, and anyone else who makes a contribution for this purpose. My congratulations are also extended to all of the premierships and award winners for 2024-25 and best wishes to all competitors for 2025-26.

Recognition and thanks are also extended to Myles Guy and Beck Frostick for what they do for CWW. Our daily banter is warmly welcomed, our competition conversations keep it real, and your activities with the clubs are very much appreciated.

In closing, please note that my focus will always be centred on two things;

- Firstly, getting a game of cricket on the field, and
- Secondly, ways of improving the Wagga Cricket competition

Incorporating the above mantra, the winter has been spent preparing for, and in anticipation of the season ahead, and I, like many of you, am looking forward to the first ball being bowled in October.
